UNIFORM POLICY

The uniform code at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton Regional School will be strictly enforced. Each child must comply with the code. If a problem arises and your child is unable to wear the complete uniform on a given day, please notify the classroom teacher by sending a note. All uniforms must be purchased at Ideal Uniform Store.

White knit shirts for boys and girls in grades 1-5 / blue knit shirts for grades 6-8, may be worn during the months of September, October, May, and June. If a student is not wearing the white/blue knit shirt, he/she must wear the shirt and tie that are part of the regular school uniform.

White knit shirts will be worn for Kindergarten students all year round.

During the winter months, if a child wishes to wear a sweater, it must be a uniform sweater. No other sweaters may be worn in the classroom.

In order to provide an atmosphere conducive to learning, it is required that all students follow the following uniform code:

SEAS Sport or Logo Sweatshirts may only be worn in the month of January during the school day.

- Makeup may not be worn.
- ➤ One necklace, inside the collar, may be worn No choker style necklaces.
- ➤ One watch or bracelet on each arm may be worn—Fitbits/Apple/Smart/Internet Capable Watches are not permitted.
- No writing on the body, body art, or body jewelry is permitted.
- ➤ Girls may wear one earring (on the lobe) per ear. Earrings are to be no bigger than the size of a quarter. Boys are not permitted to wear earrings.
- ➤ Girls' skirts/shorts are not to be rolled at the waist
- ➤ Girls' skirts or jumpers are to be just (no more than 1 inch) above the knee (Please plan ahead to the spring months and leave a hem if it needs to be taken down)
- ➤ ****Girls socks are to be navy blue or white knee socks ONLY! Boys in grades 6-8 may wear blue, black or gray dress socks ONLY. No logos or prints.****
- > Gym day Socks need to be at least **3 inches** above the ankle and white only. No logos.
- > Uniform shoes are for Grades K-8. Please refer to the next page and the student handbook for details.
- > Hair must be presentable and in good taste (collar length or shorter for boys).
- No shaved heads, designs (ex: #'s, letters etc.), no mohawk style hair, no man buns, no hair extensions, and no feather extensions are permitted. No colored, highlighted, nor dyed hair is permitted. Hair cannot hang over the eyes.
- > Headbands with no decorative apparel. They may only be black, white, blue, or uniform color plaid.
- ➤ Boys' pants must be secured at the <u>waist</u> with a plain black belt for grades 1-8.

 Tight ripped pants are not permitted on dress down days. Short shorts may not be worn on dress down days. **Bermuda shorts** are permitted during the months of September, October, May, and June only.
- Tank tops, crop tops, tube tops, sheer shirts, and tops that do not cover the midriff, cleavage, or shoulders are not to be worn to school on dress down days; this includes class trips.
- > Hats, bandanas, visors, headscarves or wristbands may not be worn inside the building at any time.
- > Key chains, chains or ropes may not extend out of a student's pocket.

All requirements refer to both boys and girls unless otherwise specified.

Uniform Shoes

Grades K-4: Black Velcro, lace tie rubber-soled or black oxford penny loafers shoes for boys and girls.

Girls' shoes should have a strap across the top; no ballet flats/slippers will be permitted. Boys should wear black uniform shoes; sneaker-like shoes are not permitted.

Grades 5-8: Black Leather CLASSIC OXFORD penny loafers ONLY for boys and girls.

This is a standard uniform shoe for every student. Girls' shoes should not have any type of platform or heel on their loafers. They must be classic oxford style and meet the specifications above. NO EXCEPTIONS unless medical notes from a doctor are provided.

Backpacks

Backpacks on wheels are not permitted.

Dress Down Days

A student may have Dress Down Day on his or her birthday. Students who celebrate their birthday during the summer months may celebrate on their half birthday.

Gym Uniform

The St. Elizabeth Ann Seton gym uniform is to be worn on assigned gym days with sneakers in lieu of the daily uniform.

T-shirt Grey - Navy School Logo Sweatshirt* Navy – White School Logo Navy - White School Logo Sweatpants* Navy - White School Logo Shorts

All students are to wear sneakers with white socks that are at least three inches above the ankle for gym.

No jewelry may be worn on gym days.

**NOTE Sweatshirts and sweatpants are required as part of the regular gym uniform. During winter

months, shorts and t-shirts may be worn underneath the sweats for gym class. During the winter months, sweatpants must be worn throughout the day in the classrooms.

be issued at any time during the school year if the guidelines are not followed. All students in grades 4-8 must sign with parents and return to school by September 6th. Parents of children in Grades K-3, please return with only your signature. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

Registration & Fee Schedules: There is a one time a year \$30 family registration fee payable to St. Elizabeth Ann Seton that is to be enclosed with your registration forms. *Monthly fees are payable in advance on or before the 15th of each month.

*Fees: 1 child - 4 days per week or less \$22.00 per day

2 children \$20.00 per day per child 3 or more children \$18.00 per day per child

Discount for Full Time students \$95 per week (5 days per week) (\$19.00 per day)

- 7^{th} / 8^{th} grade **siblings** may be part of the program for \$10.00 a day provided they assist staff with younger children during the program.
- The above discounted fees are based upon receipt of payment on the scheduled due date.

Hours of Operation: Monday thru Friday - Dismissal to 6:00 PM Half Day ASP (pending sufficient registration)

**Faculty: Certified teachers and aides staff the program. The staff is dedicated to providing a safe, educational, structured, and pleasant environment for your children.

Calendars: Calendars are due on or before the beginning of each month, along with payment. Any changes must be made with the director in advance. Any child not scheduled for a particular day will be directed to his/her bus. Please notify the director, classroom teacher, and bus teacher of any changes in writing. *Payments must be made monthly to allow children to continue with the program.

Pick up Procedures: Your child will only be released to you, or an authorized person designated by you. Please be sure to keep your child's release up-to-date. License ID will be required from authorized individuals unknown to staff. If there is a question about this, the child will not be released until a verbal confirmation can be obtained. All children must be signed out on a daily basis.

The After School Program closes promptly at 6:00 PM. If you are detained and cannot pick up your child by 6:00 PM, please arrange to have an authorized adult do so for you. If we have not heard from you and it is after 6:00 PM, the director will contact a person on your emergency list to pick up your child. After 6:00 PM, a \$15.00 late fee will be charged for every 15 minutes you are delayed. Excessive lateness will result in your child being removed from the program.

**Health: For the safety and well-being of your child and others, sick children should be kept home. Should your child become sick or injured during program hours, you, or a designated emergency contact, will be notified and asked to pick up your child as soon as possible. If your child is unable to participate in any activity or has any medical issues, please notify the director.

**Snack: A snack is provided every afternoon. Snack usually consists of a choice of cookies, crackers, pretzels, chips, or goldfish with water. If your child has special medical or dietary restrictions, please notify the staff and send a snack from home.

****Activities:** Homework help, games, movies, bingo, arts & crafts, and outside activities

**All students in the After School program will be kept in grade appropriate cohorts. All school safety protocols and policies will be followed in the After School Program.

Commitment to Service Obligation

A Catholic education provides our children with a solid foundation of Christian values, along with an education of excellence. There is a lot of hard work that goes on behind the scenes to make this happen, and a vast majority begins with our volunteers.

Volunteering does not always have to take place during the school day. There are many volunteer positions that can be done during the evenings and/or weekends. This would alleviate the burden of the small population of volunteers that we currently have who give their time almost on a daily basis to keep our programs and events running.

Our SPIRIT Board has open positions available for the next school year, and you will be given the opportunity at Back to School Night in September to sign up for these events. *All volunteers must have a SEAS approved volunteer badge to perform service*. - The use of aerosol products with a directed spray in containers of 18 fluid ounces or less when used to protect individuals from an imminent threat from stinging and biting insects including venomous spiders, bees, wasps, and hornets.


